For example, she used neutral space to explain the leg, demonstrated the ability to integrate depicting verbs, adjectives, and adverbs when describing the symptoms and causes of the leg problem, and explained the surgical procedure (before, during, and after surgery). She also summarized key vocabulary and phrases related to personal hygiene.
